
Membership Fees.

Demo Report

Rich Varney, former editor of the IWG magazine, came to the Wood Shed on Saturday 14th January 2023 to present the first demo of the year.

Rich's project was a stylised box based on a musical note, an idea he had while watching a concert and something he has been working on, to perfect, for quite a long time. In the developmental



process he introduced the use of a CNC cutter to make part of the note.

The box part of the note, the 'notehead' was a very intricately laid out element because the box had to come off the stem at about 20 degrees and accommodate the stem at one end so Rich used a wedge to drill a hole in the Cherry blank for the stem to fit in after ensuring the layout lines were centred properly and the stem wouldn't protrude into the box after it was hollowed.

When drilling the hole for the stem Rich used a jig that incorporated a fidget spinner bearing to ensure the drill was going straight and prevent friction from expanding the jig hole during use and thus affecting future use. Any bearing of a suitable size for the drill will work. Rich was careful to explain how important alignment was for the various drilling and cutting tasks to ensure as near perfect a result as possible.

When making the box Rich roughed the blank down and parted it on the centre line, preparing the tenon for later. He hollowed the box parts in a chuck and used each to size the other before assembling the box and finishing it between centres to get a perfect curve on the profile.

The most critical element of this project was the layout for the box. Essentially, ensure everything is square, equally divided along the centre line and the layout for the hole at one end ensures the stem will not appear in the box. Rich described the process in extreme detail, too much to be able to include here, but it boiled down to accuracy being of utmost importance.

This was an interesting project and we thank Rich for making the long journey from Dublin to entertain, and educate, us.
